Elections 2017

On Election Day Mayfield School will be open for voting. As the election is getting closer it is time to do some research on what each party will offer. NZEI (Primary Teachers Union) are encouraging people to vote for our children. In primary schools, funding needs to keep up with the cost of education. Our funding, like other schools was frozen this year. At Mayfield School, there is a shortfall of around \$60,000 that the school needs to raise through donations and other means to keep things how they are. (And that's without funding for an extra teacher) We are lucky to have a supportive community! Look at party's policies for a catch-up boost to school funding, an end to national standards and charter schools as these narrow learning and are taking money from public education, and a plan to recruit and train more teachers to address the shortage. Look for parties that are going to help out with funding of Teacher Aides through direct government funding (similar to how teachers are paid) as currently Teacher Aides jobs are at risk every year when we look at our budgets. They do a great job with those that need extra help. There is a bit of homework for you to do but then you can make an informed decision that should help your child get the best from their education.




