National Standards

With a change in government, has come the announcement that national standards will be abolished next year. This has been welcomed by most in education who believe that national standards have had a detrimental effect on children's learning and that children can be labelled negatively (as being below or well below the standard) even though they are making good academic progress. The benefit of national standards has been the increased focus of teachers to work collectively to decide where our children sit in relation to these standards. This involves teachers having to make an Overall Teacher judgement based on a variety assessments not one test. As a staff, we constantly discuss student progress and where our children fit against the standards. This week we worked with the staff of Mt Somers Springburn School, looking at writing, comparing writing samples from the two schools, ensuring there was consistency. Schools reported on student progress before national standards and will continue to do so from next year. The only change will be instead of reporting in relation to national standards we will report on progress against curriculum levels.

Mayfield School Charitable Trust

Last week the Mayfield School Charitable Trust made a grant to the school for \$27,000. This grant covers the cost of various school items which are not covered by the money the school receives from the Ministry of Education. These items include; purchase of laptops, Kapahaka tuition, Year 7 and 8 technology fees, Life Education Caravan costs, Wireless upgrade, robotics equipment, library scanner, Hall hire, professional development for teachers and a very small contribution to the salary of our extra teacher. Usually the school makes a yearly application to the Trust to help with the running costs of school. The trust was established in 2004 with the objective of providing financial assistance to the school. The trust consists of three community representatives and two board of trustee's

representatives. The school would like to thank all the members of the community that contribute to the school through the cattle grazing scheme.

Make a difference Ki te whakapiki

What is a school board of trustees?

Every state and state-integrated school in New Zealand has a board of trustees.

School board membership includes elected parent representatives, an elected staff representative and the principal. If the school has students above year 9, the board also includes a student representative.

What do trustees do?

First and foremost a board is accountable for student progress and achievement to its parents and community. The board has the overall responsibility for the school. This includes legal obligations covering curriculum, property, personnel, finance and health and safety.

Here are some specific things the board does:

- Sets the strategic direction and long-term plans for the school and monitors the board's progress against thom
- Monitors and evaluates student progress and achievement.
- Oversees the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.
- Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Māori Learners, Pasifika Learners and Learners with special education needs are identified, planned for and met.
- Fulfils the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.
- Appoints and supports the principal and assesses their performance

What skills do trustees need?

Trustees are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing the school's performance are in place. Who can become a trustee?

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can be nominated for election to a school board. Your school will be happy to help you find out more about standing for election or nominating someone else.

How is a board elected?

The school staff and parents elect boards of trustees every three years. Those boards that have opted into staggered (mid-term) elections hold elections every 18 months.

All parents of students who are enrolled full-time in a state or state-integrated school can and should vote in the elections for parent representatives.

What help do school trustees get?

New Zealand School Trustees Association, through a Ministry of Education contract, provides free employment and governance advice, support and resources. NZSTA also provides a variety of professional development. opportunities for trustees.
