Youth Sports	Ken opened by introducing K.C. Henke. Ken invited K.C. to		
	come talk to the group today. K.C. shared with the group the		
	need of another community that supports softball. K.C. feels		
	GI is that community. GI has better facilities for both Baseball		
	& Softball, however, GI is falling behind quickly as York is in		
	the process of creating a softball/baseball complex. Right		
	now the girls' softball teams spend most of their weekends in		

Lincoln, Omaha & Kansas City for softball tournaments. Currently GI only has five (5) softball tournaments a year. K.C. has talked to hotel operators about putting "heads in beds" and how this would be a revenue generator for hotels, restaurants and stores. K.C. suggested there be a coordinator that can work to schedule the tournaments coordinating with other events happening in the area. Rhonda mentioned right now the hotels don't know about these events until the people start calling to book rooms. Ken asked what % of the 81 acres are we now using north of town at Eagle Scout for ball fields and soccer fields? K.C. thinks the soccer fields are complete. K.C. believes the area is approximately 50% complete. Gene stated we need: 1. Coordinator 2. More fields 3. Better coordination with City and Leagues. Gene asked if we can get an estimate of what it will cost to finish the ball fields to include in the Occupational Tax, it with the solution of the offender ball the town offender ball the ball fields to include in the Occupational Tax, it

Cindy reported the group is currently working on potential	
ballot language. They are trying to use keywords that will be	
attractive to Voters. They also want to make the wording	
broad enough to indicate it will be used for "Quality of Life	
Improvements", and will not be used to fund normal	
everyday operations of the city. Cindy mentioned the	
wording will have to go to the Attorney for review and then	
to City Council Members.
