## *Israel, Jordan and Egypt Yacht Cruise Program Tel Aviv-Aqaba*

DAY	PLACE	PROGRAM
1	Tel Aviv (Israel)	Afternoon embarkation at 15:00 in Herzliya Marina, Tel Aviv. Welcome cocktail and departure to Port Said. Dinner and overnight at sea.
2	Port Said (Egypt)	Morning arrival in Port Said. Optional all-day excursion to Cairo, the capital and the largest city of Egypt, and also the biggest city of the Arab world. The city name can be translated as "the one who won". Cairo is sometimes called "Mother of the World". The area around the city was an important focal point of Ancient Egypt with the great pyramids of Giza and the step pyramid of Sakkara. Cairo is a place of the oldest university in the world that was open in 972. Return to the ship by 22:00 to join the Canal Convoy at 22:30. Overnight crossing the Suez Canal.
3	Suez Canal (Egypt)	Day crossing the Suez Canal, a unique experience. Enjoy your day relaxing at the Upper deck lounge area, gazing at the passing scenery. Afternoon canal exit in Suez. Overnight at sea to Hurghada.
4	Gubal Islands/ El Gouna - Hurgada (Egypt)	Mid-day arrival in Gubail Islands or El Gouna, both famous for their turquoise waters and beautiful white sandy beaches. They are also called as the pearls of the Red Sea. Swim stop and deck BBQ. Late arrival in Hurghada. Overnight in port.
5	Hurghada	One night/two days excursion to Luxor. Overnight at Luxor hotel and optional Luxor excursion, this magnificent Ancient City that has been called the "world's greatest open-air museum." In the afternoon, after checking in, optional excursion to Luxor Temples and Karnak, that is the second most visited historical site in Egypt after Giza Pyramids, and the largest ancient religious site in the world. Over thirty pharaohs contributed to the building of this complex of temples. The site reached a size, complexity, and the diversity not seen elsewhere. Overnight in Luxor hotel.
6	Hurghada	Morning optional excursion in Luxor to discover the Valley of the Kings, the Hatshepsut Temple, dedicated to the only ever female Pharaoh, and to the Colossi of Memnon. The Valley stands on the west bank of the Nile and is the place where the tomb of Tutankhamun was discovered. Afternoon return to Hurghada to re-embark the ship. Overnight at sea to Aqaba.
7	Aqaba (Jordan)	Mid-day arrival in Aqaba - Optional Wādi Ramm excursion. The desert of Wādi Ramm, translated either as "Valley of light sand" or as "Roman Valley" (the latter due to the propensity of Roman architecture in the area), known also as "Valley of the Moon", is the largest desert valley (wadi) in Jordan. This cut into the sandstone and granite rock desert valley has been used as a background setting of extraterrestrial planet's surface in numerous science-fiction films and since 2005 has become one of UNESCO's protected World Heritage Sites. Overnight in port.
8	Aqaba (Jordan)	Disembarkation at 9:00 am after breakfast.

DAY	PLACE	PROGRAM
1	Aqaba (Jordan)	Transfer from Tel Aviv. Embarkation in Aqaba port at 16:00. Welcome cocktail and dinner on board.
2	Sharm El Sheikh - Hurghada (Egypt)	Morning Arrival. Optional excursion to Sharm El Sheikh monastery, officially called "Sacred Monastery of the God-Trodden Mount Sinai", is an Eastern Orthodox monastery located on the Sinai Peninsula. The monastery is controlled by the autonomous Church of Sinai, part of the wider Greek Orthodox Church, and is UNESCO World Heritage Site. Built between 548 and 565, the monastery is one of the oldest working Christian monasteries in the world. The site contains the world's oldest continually operating library, possessing many unique books including the Syriac Sinaiticus and, until 1859, the Codex Sinaiticus. Another optional excursion includes snorkeling in Sharm El Sheikh, and discovering the abundant underwater world of this Red Sea gem. Late evening arrival in Hurghada. Overnight in port.
3	Hurghada (Egypt)	One night/two days excursion to Luxor. Overnight at Luxor hotel and optional Luxor excursion, this magnificent Ancient City that has been called the "world's greatest open-air museum." In the afternoon, after checking in, optional excursion to Luxor Temples and Karnak, that is the second most visited historical site in Egypt after Giza Pyramids, and the largest ancient religious site in the world. Over thirty pharaohs contributed to the building of this complex of temples. The site reached a size, complexity, and the diversity not seen elsewhere. Overnight in Luxor hotel.
4	Hurghada (Egypt)	Morning optional excursion in Luxor to discover the Valley of the Kings, the Hatshepsut Temple, dedicated to the only ever female Pharaoh, and to the Colossi of Memnon. 5	Suez Port (Egypt)	Day at sea with lectures about the ancient world, its rich history and heritage. Arrival in Suez late in the afternoon. Overnight in port.
6	Suez Port (Egypt)	Optional all-day excursion to Cairo, the capital and the largest city of Egypt, and also the biggest city of the Arab world. The city name can be translated as "the one who won". Cairo is sometimes called "Mother of the World". The area around the city was an important focal point of Ancient Egypt with the great pyramids of Giza and the step pyramid of Sakkara. Cairo is a place of the oldest university in the world that was open in 972. Return to the ship by 21:00 to join the Canal Convoy at 21:30. Overnight crossing the Suez Canal.
7	Suez Canal (Egypt)	Crossing the Suez Canal is a unique experience. Enjoy your day relaxing at the Upper deck lounge area, gazing at the passing scenery. Afternoon arrival in Port Said. Overnight at sea to Tel Aviv.
8	Tel Aviv (Israel)	Early morning arrival to Tel Aviv. Disembarkation at 9:00 am after breakfast.
